Whereas, no comprehensive study of these problems has yet been undertaken; and

WHEREAS, such a study is essential for both the successful operation of the Airport and for the welfare of Anne Arundel County; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a Commission be appointed by the President of the Senate of Maryland and the Speaker of the House of Delegates of Maryland, for the purpose of studying; THE JOINT BUDGET AND AUDIT COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IS REQUESTED TO STUDY;

- (1) The need for access roads to and from the Airport within a reasonable area surrounding it.
- (2) The need for increased police services to adequately meet the needs for police protection at the Airport and surrounding area.
 - (3) The lack of ambulance facilities.
- (4) The need for increased fire protection at the Airport, with special emphasis on the many types of fire-fighting equipment required by the airport but not normally used by fire departments at large; and be it further

Resolved, That the recommendations of this Commission THE COMMITTEE be reported not later than November 1, 1971 to the Governor, the Department of Transportation, the County Executive and County Council of Anne Arundel County, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Delegates.
