WHEREAS, This annual celebration of the arts, planned by hundreds of volunteers from the Annapolis area, is a tribute to the cultural vitality of the State; now, therefore, be it

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That a request be submitted to the Governor to declare the week of June 13 to 20, 1971, as "Fine Arts Week" and that the Maryland Division of Tourism give support to this event; and, be it further*

*Resolved, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to the Governor and to the Division of Tourism.*

(House Joint Resolution 47)

House Joint Resolution requesting the Department of Forests and Parks to make the camping facilities of the Maryland parks system available to the Maryland Units of the Boy Scouts of America on a year-round basis.

WHEREAS, The Boy Scouts of America are rendering valuable public service in conservation and other civic activities in the State of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, The Scouting program is directed to outdoor experience designed to teach self-reliance, the brotherhood of man and desirable traits of character; and

WHEREAS, The adventures of camping and hiking are an essential part of the Scouting program; now, therefore, be it
