House Bill No. 624—Operation of Emergency Vehicles

AN ACT to add new Section 6-102.1A to Article 66½ of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1970 Replacement Volume), title "Vehicle Laws," subtitle "Drivers' Licenses," subheading "Part I. Issuance of Licenses, Expiration and Renewal," to follow immediately after Section 6-102.1 thereof, to authorize a member of a bona fide volunteer fire company, volunteer fire department or volunteer rescue squad who holds a Class D drivers' license to operate an emergency vehicle under certain conditions.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 624.

This bill provides that a member of a volunteer fire department who is at least 18 years old and holds a Class D driver's license may operate an emergency vehicle upon the approval of the chief officer of the volunteer fire department.
