

the purposes of these regulations "existing fuel burning equipment" shall mean equipment installed prior to the effective date of this Subtitle.

Section 13-315.21—Visible Emissions from New Fuel Burning Equipment.

No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emissions from any new fuel burning equipment which are darker in shade or appearance than that designated as No. 1 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart, or of such opacity as to obscure an observer's view to a degree greater than does smoke designated as No. 1 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart. Compliance with Section 13-315.24 shall be accepted as compliance with this Sub-heading. For the purpose of these regulations "new fuel burning equipment" shall mean equipment installed on or after the effective date of this Subtitle.

Section 13-315.22—Visible Emissions from Incinerators

No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit, emissions from any incinerator that are darker in shade or appearance than that designated as No. 1 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart; or of such opacity as to obscure an observer's view to a degree greater than does smoke designated as No. 1 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart.

Section 13-315.23—Visible Emissions from Other Installations

(a) No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emissions from any existing installation that are equal to or darker in shade or appearance than that designated as No. 2 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart; or of such opacity as to obscure an observer's view to a degree equal to or greater than does smoke designated as No. 2 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart.

(b) No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit emissions from any new installation that are darker in shade or appearance than that designated as No. 1 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart; or of such opacity as to obscure an observer's view to a degree greater than does smoke designated as No. 1 on the Ringelmann Smoke Chart.

(a) Visible emissions existing at ground level past the property line of an installation are prohibited.

(d) For the purposes of this Subtitle "new installations" shall mean an installation constructed on or after the effective date of this Subtitle.

Section 13-315.24—Particulate Matter from Fuel Burning Equipment

(a) No person shall cause, suffer, allow or permit particulate matter caused by the combustion of fuel to be discharged from any stack or chimney into the atmosphere in excess of the hourly rate set forth in the following table:
