

application shall state the date and time of said parade, the number and types of units participating in said parade, the estimated attendance, the proposed route, and such other information as may be requested by the Anne Arundel County Police Department or the Department of Inspections and Permits. The requirement for said permit shall not infringe upon the freedom of the right to assemble; said permit shall be issued BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INSPECTIONS AND PERMITS' except in instances in which the Chief of Police of the Anne Arundel County Police Department (or his designee) determines that the safety and convenience of the public in the use of the streets or sidewalks would be unduly disturbed.

(B) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION TO THE CONTRARY, PARADE PERMITS MAY BE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF INSPECTIONS AND PERMITS IN INSTANCES WHERE THE APPLICATION HAS BEEN MADE LESS THAN THIRTY (30) DAYS PRIOR TO THE ANTICIPATED PARADE DATE, PROVIDED THE CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT (OR HIS DESIGNEE) APPROVES SAID APPLICATION, AND ADVISES THE DEPARTMENT OF INSPECTIONS AND PERMITS, IN WRITING, THAT THE SAFETY AND CONVENIENCE OF THE PUBLIC IN THE USE OF THE STREETS OR SIDEWALKS WOULD NOT BE UNDULY DISTURBED.

(bC) The fee for said permit shall be One Dollar (\$1.00). FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, A PARADE IS DEFINED AS ANY PUBLIC PROCESSION OF PERSONS, VEHICLES AND/OR FLOATS (OR ANY COMBINATION THEREOF).

(eD) Upon conviction of a violation of this section, any participant of said parade shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be fined Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00).

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Ordinance ~~shall take effect forty five days after it becomes law~~ IS HEREBY DECLARED TO BE AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AND NECESSARY FOR THE IMMEDIATE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC PEACE, HEALTH, SAFETY, WELFARE, AND PROPERTY, AND BEING PASSED BY THE AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF FIVE (5) MEMBERS OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL, THE SAME SHALL TAKE EFFECT FROM THE DATE IT BECOMES LAW.
