Uniform Act For Voting By New Residents In Presidential Elections

28-1.

- (a) Each citizen of the United States who has been a resident of this State for less than [twelve] six months on the day before the day of a presidential election, may vote for presidential and vice-presidential electors at that election, but for no other officers or matters submitted to the voters, provided [(a)] (1) he shall have resided in a ward or election district where he offers to vote at least [forty-five] thirty days next preceding such presidential election, [(b)] (2) otherwise possesses the substantive qualifications to vote in this State; except the requirements of residence and registration, and [(c)] (3) complies with the provisions of this subtitle.
- (b) Each citizen of the United States who is qualified to vote in any County or Baltimore City in any election for President and Vice President and has begun residence in another State after the 30th day next preceding such election and, for that reason, does not satisfy the registration requirements of such State, he shall be allowed to vote for the choice of electors for President and Vice President, or for President and Vice President, in such election, (1) in person in the County or Baltimore City in which he resided immediately prior to his removal to another State if he had satisfied, as of the date of his change of residence, the requirements to vote in that County or Baltimore City, or (2) by absentee ballot in the
