## CHAPTER 718

(House Bill 1000)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 691 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume), title "Health," subtitle "Air Quality Control," amending the term "air pollution" in the Air Quality Control Act in order to provide that the term does not include the presence in the outdoor atmosphere of substances which are no more than a temporary nuisance or an inconsequential inconvenience SHALL NOT BE APPLIED TO DISCHARGES TO THE ATMOSPHERE FROM THE HARVESTING, DRYING, LOADING OR UNLOADING OF CORN OR GRAIN.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland. That Section 691 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume), title "Health," subtitle "Air Quality Control," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

691.

For the purposes of this subtitle:

(a) The term "air pollution" shall mean the presence in the outdoor atmosphere of substances in quantities, having characteristics and being of a duration which, from any single source or in combination with other sources, are, or may be predicted with reasonable certainty to be injurious to human, plant or animal life or to property, or which unreasonably interfere with the proper enjoyment of the property of others by reason of the emission of odors, solids, vapors, liquids or gases, throughout the State and in such areas of the State as are affected thereby. The term does not include the presence in the outdoor atmosphere of substances which
