RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES IS REQUESTED TO REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BY MARCH 1, 1972 AS TO WHAT EFFORTS HAVE BEEN MADE TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 4P OF ARTICLE 14B OF THE ANNOTATED CODE AS ENACTED BY CHAPTER 793 OF THE LAWS OF 1969 TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF ABANDONED BOATS AND TO ADVISE THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY IF ANY FURTHER ACTION IS NEEDED FROM THE STAND POINT OF LEGISLATION OR FUNDING IN THIS AREA; AND BE IT FURTHER
