Charter Amendment

Resolution No. 52

Resolution of the Mayor and City Council of Cumberland, Maryland, adopted pursuant to the authority contained in Article 11-E of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, and Section 13 of Article 23A of the Annotated Code of Maryland, entitled "Municipal Corporations," as said Section was enacted by Chapter 423 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, 1955, entitled, "A RESOLUTION TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CUMBERLAND (1966 EDITION), BEING ARTICLE 1A OF THE CODE OF PUBLIC LOCAL LAWS OF MARYLAND, BY REPEALING AND REENACTING SECTION 162 OF SAID CHARTER, SPECIFYING QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS."

Section 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF CUMBERLAND, That Section 162 of the Charter of the City of Cumberland, be and is hereby repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

"Any person shall be eligible to register as a voter in municipal elections who is a citizen of the United States, a resident of the City for at least [one year] $six\ months$, and at least [twenty-one] eighteen years of age at the time of the next municipal election."
