Deficiencies beyond the investigational allowances as established by regulation in any other constituent(s) covered under Section 473, par. (P) 2, 3 and 4 of this act, which the registrant is required to or may guarantee, shall be evaluated and penalties prescribed [therefore] therefor by the State Chemist.
