Code of Public General Laws for exchange with other states; to the Enoch Pratt Free Library of Baltimore City, two copies of each; to the executive department of each state and territory of the Union, one copy of the laws and journals; to the Board of Correction, one copy of the laws; to the mayor and city council of Baltimore, two copies of the laws; to the chief judge and each of the associate judges of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, one copy of the laws; to the clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore City, the clerk of the Court of Common Pleas, the clerk of the circuit courts of Baltimore City, the clerk of the Criminal Court of Baltimore, and the clerk of the Baltimore City Court, one copy of the laws for the use of their respective offices and one copy of the journals for the inspection of the citizens; to the Register of Wills of Baltimore City, one copy of the laws; for each judge of the orphans' court, one copy of the laws and one copy for the office; one copy of the laws for the Chief Judge and each associate judge of the District Court [people's court, and each judge of the Municipal Court of the City of Baltimore]; to the clerks of the circuit courts for the several counties, one copy of the laws for office use and one copy of the journals for the inspection of the citizens; to each of the associate judges of the several judicial circuits, except the eighth circuit, one copy of the laws; one copy of the laws and journals for each member of the General Assembly; one copy for the offices of the county commissioners: \( \bar{\pi}\) and one copy for each trial magistrate, substitute magistrate and people's court judge in and for their respective counties]; the said copies to be delivered by the clerks of the circuit courts and the clerks of the Baltimore City Court. The remaining volumes of the Session Laws and journals, including copies of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, deposited in the State Library, shall be retained in the State Library or distributed under the supervision and direction of the library committee of the Maryland State Library or may be used by the State Library for exchange purposes.

## 165. Distribution of opinions of Court of Appeals and Court of Special Appeals.

The published opinions of the Court of Appeals and of the Court of Special Appeals shall be distributed by the Director in the following manner, that is to say: to the Court of Appeals, two copies for the office and one for each of the judges thereof; to the Court of Special Appeals, two copies for the office and one for each of the judges thereof; to each of the associate judges of the circuit courts for the several counties, to the chief judge and the associate judges of the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City, one copy each for the use of their respective offices; to the clerks of the circuit courts for the several counties and of the City of Baltimore and the clerk of the Superior Court of Baltimore City, the clerk of the Court of Common Pleas, the clerk of the Baltimore City Court, and the clerk of the Criminal Court of Baltimore, one copy each; to the Chief Judge and each associate judge of the District Court, one copy each; to the registers of wills throughout the State for the use of the registers of wills and orphans' court, one copy; to the Commissioner of the Land Office, one copy; to the executive chamber, one copy; to the Library of Congress, five copies; to the Enoch Pratt Free Library of Baltimore City, two copies; to the General Assembly, eight copies; and to the executive department of each state in the Union, one copy; to the Comptroller of the treasury, the Treasurer of Maryland, the Department of Legislative
