The amount of the annual apportionment to each institution meeting the requirements of § 66 of this subtitle shall be computed by multiplying by two hundred dollars the number of earned associate of arts degrees, and by five hundred dollars (1) the number of earned bachelor's, AND (2), TO THE EXTENT THAT SUFFICIENT FUNDS ARE PROVIDED IN THE ANNUAL STATE BUDGET, I MASTER'S, DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY, JURIS DOCTOR, DOCTOR OF EDUCATION degrees, II THE NUMBER OF ADVANCED DEGREES BEYOND BACCALAUREATE, INCLUDING FIRST PROFESSIONAL DEGREES, conferred in this State by such institution during the fiscal year next preceding the fiscal year for which such apportionment is made. TO THE EXTENT THAT SUFFICIENT FUNDS ARE NOT PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET FOR THE FULL COST OF (2) ABOVE, THE AMOUNT PER DEGREE THEREOF SHALL BE REDUCED ON A PRO RATA BASIS. There shall be excluded from any such computation the number of seminarian or theological degrees conferred by the institution or any degree which is awarded in substitution of a previously earned degree.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1973.

CHAPTER 717

(Senate Bill 849)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 12(a) of Article 49B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1972 Replacement Volume), title "Human Relations Commission," subtitle "Enforcement Powers of Commission," to require that a complaint under the Human Relations Commission law must be filed within a certain period of time.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 12(a) of Article 49B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1972 Replacement Volume), title "Human Relations Commission," subtitle "Enforcement Powers of Commission," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

12.

(a) Any person claiming to be aggrieved by an alleged discrimination prohibited by any section of this article may make, sign and file with the Human Relations Commission (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission") a complaint in writing under oath. The complaint shall state the name and address of the person, firm, association, partnership, corporation, State agency, department or board alleged to have committed the act of discrimination together with the particulars thereof; and the complaint also shall contain such other information as may be required from time to time by the Commission. A COMPLAINT MUST BE FILED WITHIN [ONE YEAR] SIX MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF THE OCCURRENCE ALLEGED TO BE A VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE. A COMPLAINT FILED WITH THE FEDERAL OR WITH A LOCAL HUMAN RELATIONS COMMISSION WITHIN SIX MONTHS FROM THE DATE OF OCCURRENCE SHALL BE DEEMED TO HAVE
