
CHAPTER 772

(House Bill 401)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 70-2(d-3) of Article 26 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1972 Interim Supplement), title "Courts," subtitle "Juvenile Causes," to deny Juvenile Court jurisdiction in certain situations involving minors.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Section 70-2(d-3) of Article 26 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1972 Interim Supplement), title "Courts," subtitle "Juvenile Causes," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

70-2.

- (d) The court does not have jurisdiction over:
- (1) A proceeding involving a child who has reached his 14th birthday, alleged to have done an act which, if committed by an adult, would be a crime punishable by death or life imprisonment (including a lesser offense or an offense arising out of the act alleged to have been committed), unless an order removing the proceeding to the juvenile court has been filed pursuant to Section 594A of Article 27;
- (2) A proceeding involving a child who has reached his 16th birthday, alleged to have done an act in violation of any provision of Article 66 1/2 or any other traffic law or ordinance (other than manslaughter by automobile, possession of a stolen motor vehicle, unauthorized use or occupancy of a motor vehicle, tampering with a motor vehicle, or a violation of Section 11-902 of Article 66 1/2);
- (3) A proceeding involving a child who has reached his sixteenth birthday, alleged to have done an act lin violation of Section 488 of Article 27 concerning the crime of robbery with a deadly weapon, l WHICH, IF COMMITTED BY AN ADULT, WOULD BE PUNISHABLE BY SECTION 488 OF ARTICLE 27 AS ROBBERY WITH A DEADLY WEAPON, unless an order removing the proceeding to the juvenile court has been filed pursuant to Section 594A of Article 27.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1973.

CHAPTER 773

(House Bill 409)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 70-16(c) of Article 26 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Replacement Volume and 1971 Supplement), title "Courts," subtitle "Juvenile Causes," to provide that the waiver order from the Juvenile Court to the court having jurisdiction over the offense if committed by an adult be interlocutory.
