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CHAPTER 791

(House Bill 608)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Sections 10A and 10B(a) of Article 25 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Replacement Volume), title "County Commissioners," subtitle "General Provisions," to correct certain errors in the laws relating to the County Commissioners of Prince George's and Carroll counties.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Sections 10A and 10B(a) of Article 25 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1966 Replacement Volume), title "County Commissioners" subtitle "General Provisions," be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

10A.

The County Commissioners of Prince George's County are authorized to create an official advisory committee on natural resources and community appearance as may be necessary to guide and accomplish the work of the County Commissioners sitting as district counsel. The functions of the advisory committee among other things may consist of making technical recommendations for the preservation, exploitation, and site rehabilitation of mineral deposits or means and methods of encouraging development above minimum standards. Such official committee shall be established by resolution of the County Commissioners which sets forth the membership, duties, and functions.

It is the intent of the General Assembly that all State agencies, departments or commissions shall cooperate to the fullest possible extent with the County Commissioners in guiding the orderly growth of the county through such committee. Officials designated by a State agency, department, or [commissions] COMMISSION may serve on such advisory committee at the request of the County Commissioners.

10B.

(a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article, the County Commissioners of Carroll County are authorized and empowered to regulate any public road, street, avenue, lane, alley or bridge within Carroll County which is not within the corporate limits of any incorporated city or town and which [have] HAS not been designated or maintained as a part of the State or federal highway system or any extension thereof with respect to:
