- (m) Willfully makes any misrepresentation in the inspection of foodstuffs.
- (n) Fraudulently applies or reports any intradermal, cutaneours, subcutaneous, seriological, or chemical test.
- (o) Fraudulently issues or uses any health certificate, inspection certificate, vaccination certificate, test chart, or other blank form used in the practice of veterinary medicine pertaining to the dissemination of animal disease, transportation of diseased animals or the sale of inedible products of animal origin for human consumption. I
- (H) FAILS AFTER LICENSURE TO COMPLY WITH RULES OR REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD.
- (I) IS GROSSLY NEGLIGENT OR DELIBERATELY CRUEL TO AN ANIMAL.

152B.

A [qualified] licensed veterinarian may employ A VETERINARIAN AS, an assistant who has obtained a temporary permit provided that the assistant has met all the requirements of the Board as set forth in this subtitle. Any [person] VETERINARIAN applying for a temporary permit must associate himself with a Iqualified licensed AND REGISTERED veterinarian in the State, and his work shall be limited to the practice of the [qualified] LICENSED veterinarian. [and he shall not participate in the practice or operation of a branch office, clinic, or allied establishment. I The permit, when granted, shall bear the name and address of the licensed veterinarian. The applicant must present himself for examination at the next scheduled examination of the Board I.I UNLESS SUCH APPEARANCE IS WAIVED BY THE BOARD ON THE BASIS OF EXTREME HARDSHIP WITH A WRITTEN APPLICATION DETAILING THE REASONS. The fee for the permit is Itwenty-five dollars (\$25.00) FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50.00) which sum shall be applied toward the examination fee, but shall be forfeited if the applicant fails to present himself at the next scheduled examination, WITHOUT BEING EXCUSED [and the permit shall not be further renewed. The permit shall expire on the day following the announcement of the Igrades RESULTS of the first examination given after such temporary permit is issued. No more than one temporary permit may be issued to any applicant. No temporary permit may be issued to any applicant if he has previously failed the examination.

152C.

IThe Board may issue a license without a written examination to any applicant who furnished satisfactory proof that he has successfully completed the examination conducted by the National Board of Veterinary Examiners, or who has been actively engaged in practice in another state for a period of five (5) years. The applicant must, however, present himself before the Board to be interviewed and examined orally and practically.

153.

(a) Before the license of any licensee is suspended or revoked by the Board, a written copy of the complaint or charge made shall be furnished the licensee against whom the same is made, and an opportunity afforded to be heard before the Board personally and by counsel. The accused shall have the opportunity to confront the witnesses against him, and all witnesses at such hearing shall testify under oath, and the chairman or any member of the Board shall have the authority to administer the oath. The Board shall have the power to compel the attendance
