Senate Bill No. 1089 - Charles County Board of Education

In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 1089.

This bill requires the Board of Education of Charles County to purchase two specified school sites.

House Joint Resolution 113, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on May 30, 1973, accomplishes the same purpose as Senate Bill 1089. Because of the signing of House Joint Resolution 113, the sponsor of Senate Bill 1089 has concurred in the veto of this bill.

Accordingly, I have decided to veto Senate Bill 1089.

Senate Bill No. 1109 - Wage Payment and Collection Law

AN ACT to repeal Section 94 of Article 100 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1964 Replacement Volume and 1972 Supplement), title "Work, Labor and Employment," subtitle "Maryland Wage Payment and Collection Law," and to enact new Section 94 in lieu thereof, to stand in the place of the section repealed, relating generally to wage payment and collection; imposing requirements as to the regularity, frequency and medium of wage payments and permissible deductions therefrom; establishing requirements in the event of termination; imposing certain duties upon employers; providing for exceptions, conditions, civil and criminal penalties, and conferring duties as to enforcement upon the Commissioner of Labor and Industry and the Attorney General of Maryland.
