NEW CARROLLTON CHARTER AMENDMENT NO. 72-1

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AN AMENDMENT TO THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF NEW CARROLLTON, PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, MARYLAND, (Section 9 of Article 17 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, Everstine's 1963 Edition, as amended and registered pursuant to Article 23A, Section 11, ET. SEQ., of the Annotated Code of Maryland, 1957 Edition, as amended), amending Section 7a of said Charter, entitled "Elections," subtitle "Conduct and Procedure," to add a provision permitting the City Council to adopt regulations and procedures for absentee voting, for write-in candidacies, and for other matters pertaining to elections in order to provide for the orderly conduct of municipal elections.
