

PROVIDED IN THIS TITLE, ANY PERSON WHO OPERATES OR POSSESSES A GUNNING RIG IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION, INCLUDING BAG LIMIT RESTRICTIONS PROVIDED BY THIS TITLE, SHALL HAVE HIS RIG EXCLUDED FROM THE FLATS FOR THREE LEGAL GUNNING DAYS. THE PERIOD OF EXCLUSION SHALL INCLUDE ANY GUNNING DAYS THE RIG MAY HAVE BEEN EXCLUDED PRIOR TO DETERMINATION OF THE CASE.

(2) ANY NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE OFFICER OR ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER HAS FREE ACCESS TO EVERY GUNNING RIG.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection presently appears as Article 66C, section 169(c) of the Code. New language derived from similar provisions in Article 66C, section 174 is added for organizational purposes. The only other changes made are in style.

SUBTITLE 7. FIELD TRIALS AND USE OF HUNTING DOGS.

10-701. DEFINITIONS.

(A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language used as the standard introductory sentence to a definition section.

(B) "SPECIAL DOG TRAINING AREA" MEANS AN AREA OF AT LEAST 100 ACRES AND NOT EXCEEDING 250 ACRES WHERE DOGS MAY BE TRAINED AT ANY TIME OF THE YEAR.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language derived from a similar provision in Article 66C, section 146 of the Code and set forth here for the convenience of the Code user.

10-702. FIELD TRIAL PERMIT.

(A) CLUB OR ASSOCIATION REQUIRED TO OBTAIN PERMIT. - A CLUB OR ASSOCIATION MAY NOT HOLD A FIELD TRIAL WITH DOGS IN THE STATE DURING ANY CLOSED HUNTING SEASON WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE SECRETARY.

(B) ISSUANCE. - THE SECRETARY MAY GRANT A PERMIT TO FIELD TRIAL CLUBS AND ASSOCIATIONS TO HOLD FIELD TRIALS WITH RACCOON, OPOSSUM, BIRD, OR RABBIT DOGS IN
