

OF IT, MEAT, OR ANY MEAT FOOD PRODUCT CAPABLE OF USE AS HUMAN FOOD SHALL BE STORED OR OTHERWISE HANDLED BY ANY PERSON ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF BUYING, SELLING, FREEZING, STORING, OR TRANSPORTING THESE ARTICLES IN OR FOR INTRASTATE COMMERCE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section is new language derived from Art. 66C, §470J(b) of the Code.

SEC. 4-122. SALE, PURCHASE, OR TRANSPORTATION OF LIVESTOCK THAT DIED OTHERWISE THAN BY SLAUGHTER PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS.

NO PERSON ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF BUYING, SELLING, OR TRANSPORTING, IN INTRASTATE COMMERCE, ANY DEAD, DYING, DISABLED, OR DISEASED LIVESTOCK OR ANY PART OF THE CARCASS OF LIVESTOCK, THAT DIED OTHERWISE THAN BY SLAUGHTER, MAY BUY, SELL, DONATE, TRANSPORT, OR OFFER OR RECEIVE FOR SALE OR TRANSPORTATION, IN INTRASTATE COMMERCE, THE LIVESTOCK OR PART OF CARCASS, UNLESS THE TRANSACTION OR TRANSPORTATION IS MADE PURSUANT TO THE DEPARTMENTAL RULES AND REGULATIONS.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This section presently appears as Art. 66C, §470K(b) of the Code. The present reference to persons engaged in business "in this State" is proposed for deletion and a reference to "intrastate commerce" is substituted therefor. This phrase is added to clarify the legislative intent to regulate the sale and distribution of livestock and livestock carcasses in intrastate commerce; See §4-102.

The last phrase of §470K(b) is proposed for deletion because it is assumed that any rule or regulation adopted under this subtitle is done so to effectuate the purposes of the subtitle. The only other changes made are in style.

SEC. 4-123. PROHIBITED ACTS.

NO PERSON MAY COMMIT OR CAUSE THE COMMISSION OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING ACTS:

(1) SLAUGHTERING LIVESTOCK OR PREPARING ANY LIVESTOCK CARCASS, PART OF IT, OR MEAT FOOD PRODUCT IN ANY ESTABLISHMENT OPERATING SOLELY FOR
