SUBTITLE 2. MARYLAND COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER LAW.

SEC. 6-201. DEFINITIONS.

(A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language used as the standard introductory sentence to a definition section.

(B) "BRAND" MEANS THE TERM, DESIGN, TRADEMARK, OR OTHER SPECIFIC DESIGNATION UNDER WHICH A COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER OR SOIL CONDITIONER IS DISTRIBUTED IN THE STATE.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection presently appears as Art. 66C, §473(i) of the Code. The only changes made are in style.

(C) "BUYER'S MIXTURE" MEANS COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER MIXED ON SPECIFIC REQUEST OF A PURCHASER ACCORDING TO A FORMULA FURNISHED BY HIM.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection is new language derived from Art. 76C, §473(g) of the Code and is set forth here for the convenience of the Code user.

(D) "BULK FERTILIZER" MEANS ANY COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER DISTRIBUTED IN A NONPACKAGED FORM.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This subsection presently appears as Art. 66C, §473(f) of the Code. The only changes made are in style.

(E) "COMMERCIAL FERTILIZER" MEANS ANY SUBSTANCE CONTAINING A RECOGNIZED PLANT NUTRIENT USED FOR ITS PLANT NUTRIENT CONTENT AND DESIGNED FOR USE OR CLAIMED TO HAVE VALUE IN PROMOTING PLANT GROWTH, EXCEPT UNMANIPULATED ANIMAL AND VEGETABLE MANURE, MARL, LIME, WOOD ASHES, AND GYPSUM.
