the convenience of the Code user.

Language is added in subsection (b) (1) to refer to Washington County and Baltimore County to distinguish these Soil Conservation Districts from Washington, D.C. and Baltimore City.

The last sentence of subsection (c) is new language derived from the second sentence of \$91(c).

SEC. 8-202. MEETINGS: QUORUM: COMPENSATION: AUDIT.

(A) MEETINGS: CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN: QUORUM.

THE COMMITTEE ANNUALLY SHALL ELECT IN JULY A CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN FROM AMONG ITS MEMBERS. A MAJORITY OF THE COMMITTEE CONSTITUTES A QUORUM, AND THE CONCURRENCE OF A MAJORITY IN ANY MATTER IS REQUIRED FOR ITS DETERMINATION.

(B) COMPENSATION: AUDIT.

THE CHAIRMAN AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE RECEIVE NO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES ON THE COMMITTEE, BUT ARE ENTITLED TO EXPENSES, INCLUDING TRAVELING EXPENSES, NECESSARILY INCURRED IN THE DISCHARGE OF THEIR DUTIES ON THE COMMITTEE. THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE SUBJECT TO AN ANNUAL AUDIT OF THE ACCOUNTS OF RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS BY THE STATE AUDITOR.

SEC. 8-203. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES; IEGAL SERVICES.

(A) ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES.

THE COMMITTEE MAY EMPLOY AN ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, TECHNICAL EXPERTS, AND OTHER PERMANENT OR TEMPORARY EMPLOYEES, IT REQUIRES, AND SHALL DETERMINE THEIR QUALIFICATIONS, DUTIES, AND COMPENSATION.
