NATURAL RESOURCES - TITLE 3

GENERAL REVISOR'S NOTE:

The Commission to Revise the Annotated Code, in compiling Title 3 of the Natural Resources Article, concluded that certain provisions of present law originally allocated to Title 3 are repetitious, obsolete, or more properly allocable elsewhere. Accordingly, these provisions are not embodied in Title 3. Their proposed treatment is as follows:

TITLE 4. FISH AND FISHERIES

SUBTITLE 1. IN GENERAL.

4-101. DEFINITIONS - IN GENERAL.

(A) IN THIS TITLE, THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

(B) "CATCH" INCLUDES TO TAKE, KILL, TRAP, GATHER, HARVEST, OR IN ANY MANNER REDUCE ANY FISH TO PERSONAL POSSESSION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This definition is new language. It is established to avoid repetitive use throughout present statutory provision of different terms referring to the exercise of dominion and control over fish.
