SEC. 2-402. PERSONNEL.

AN APPELLATE COURT MAY APPOINT THE LAW CLERKS, STENOGRAPHERS, AND OTHER FULL OR PART TIME EMPLOYEES IT DEEMS NECESSARY.

SEC. 2-403. COMPENSATION.

THE CLERK, HIS DEPUTIES, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES OF THE COURT SHALL RECEIVE THE COMPENSATION PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

SEC. 2-404. ATTENDANCE BY SHERIFF.

AN APPELLATE COURT MAY DIRECT A SHERIFF TO ATTEND THE COURT OR PERFORM SERVICES FOR THE COURT. FOR SERVING AN APPELLATE COURT, THE SHERIFF OR HIS COUNTY SHALL RECEIVE THE COMPENSATION SET BY THE COURT.

SUBTITLE 5. COURTS OF GENERAL JURISDICTION.

SEC. 2-501. EMPLOYEES OF THE COURT.

(A) PERSONNEL AUTHORIZED.

THE JUDGES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT FOR A COUNTY, OR THE SUPREME BENCH OF BALTIMORE CITY MAY EMPLOY THE COURT ADMINISTRATORS, ASSIGNMENT COMMISSIONERS, AUDITORS, MASTERS, EXAMINERS, COURT REPORTERS, MESSENGERS, BAILIFFS, COURT CRIERS, LIBRARIANS, CLERKS, SECRETARIES, STENOGRAPHERS, JURY COMMISSIONERS, LAW CLERKS, AND OTHER EMPLOYEES NECESSARY TO CONDUCT THE BUSINESS OF THE COURT.

(B) COMPENSATION AND DUTIES.
