- SEIZURE, FORFEITURE, AND DISPOSITION OF (A) DEVICES, EQUIPMENT, OR PROPERTY. - A NABORAL RESOURCES POLICE OFFICER OR ANY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER. UPON ARRESTING ANY PERSON FOR VIOLATING ANY PROVISION OF THIS TITLE OR ANY RULE OR REGULATION PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO IT, MAY SEIZE EVERY DEVICE, EQUIPMENT, CONVEYANCE, OR PROPERTY UNLAWFULLY USED. IF THE OWNER OF PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE SELZED DEVICE, EQUIPMENT, CONVEYENCE, OR PROTERTY IS CONVICTED, THE COURT MAY DECLAR THE DEVICE, EQUIPMENT, CONVEYENCE, OF CONFICTY FORFEITED IN ADDITION TO ANY DIMES ARTHUR DE JETTE DE JETTE LE THIS TITLE. ANY FORFEITURE BECOMES THE 1 TOTALLY OF THE DEPARTMENT FOR DISPOSITION AT ITS DISCRETION. 1. THE OWNER IS NOT KNOWN, THE COURT MAY PROCEED BY PARTY TO HEAR AND DETERMINE ANY QUESTION OF FORFEITURE. IF THE OWNER OR PERSON CHARGED WITH THE VICIATION IS NOT CONVICTED, THE DEVICE, EQUIPMENT, CONVEYANCE, OR PROPERTY SEIZED SHALL BE RELEASED AND RETURNED TO HIM.
- (E) EXCEPTIONS. HOWEVER, THE DEVICE, EQUIPMENT, CONVEYANCE, OR PROPERTY MAY NOT BE [[SEIZED OR]] FORFEITED IF THE OWNER WAS NOT A CONSENTING PARTY OR PRIVY TO A VICIATION.

REVISOR'S NOTE: Subsection (a) is new language derived from Article 66C, sections 238, 240, 241, 310, and other similar provisions providing for seizure and forfeiture of unlawfully used devices, equipment, and property. The intent is to set forth a uniform seizure and forfeiture procedure rather than retaining the several different provisions presently scattered throughout 66C. Forfeiture is made a Article discretionary matter of the Court with the use of the word "may". Notwithstanding Article 26, section 155 of the Code which provides that all forfeitures are remitted District Court system, to the provision declares that forfeitures become property of the department. The District Court system appears ill-equipped to handle these forfeited items. The District Court is not anxious to assume this function and content to allow the department to appropriately dispose of items. To date, the District Court has not been presented any forfeiture situations.

The department would like to retain some forfeited property for departmental use
