STATE OF THE UNITED STATES, AND A DULY CERTIFIED COPY SHALL BE FORWARIED TO THE GOVERNOR OF EACH OF THE SIGNATORY STATES.

THIS COMFACT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE WHEN RATIFIED AND APPROVED AS PROVIDED IN ARTICLE I. ANY OIL-PRODUCING STATE MAY BECOME A PARTY HERETO BY AFFIXING ITS SIGNATURE TO A COUNTERPART TO BE SIMILARLY DEPOSITED, CERTIFIED, AND RATIFIED.

DONE IN THE CITY OF DALLAS, TEXAS, THIS SIXTEENTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1935.

REVISOR'S NOTE: This interstate compact presently does not appear in the Code although the enactment of this compact by this State presently appears as Article 66C, sections 689A to 689C. The compact, in Article VIII, indicates that it is to expire September 1, 1937. However, it has been extended with Congressional sanction and is still in effect.

NATURAL RESOURCES - TITLE 6

GENERAL REVISOR'S NOTE:
