for the Commissioner to refuse to issue or renew or suspend or revoke an insurer's certificate of authority and the Commissioner further finds that the insurer's continued writing of insurance would result in irreparable harm, and generally relating to the procedures of issuing such cease and desist orders 11 against an insurer under certain conditions.

The President put the question: Shall the bill pass notwithstanding the objections of the Executive?

The President announced the veto was sustained by roll call as follows:

This bill provides for the re-allocation of jurisdiction between the Court of Appeals and the Court of Special Appeals.

Therefore, it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 666.
