On page CJ 1-6 of the printed bill, Sec. 1-203, following line 7, insert the following:

“(C) JUDGE NOT TO HEAR CASE INVOLVING FORMER PARTNER.

WHILE HE IS RECEIVING PAYMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION, A JUDGE MAY NOT HEAR A CASE IN WHICH A PARTNER OR EMPLOYEE OF HIS FORMER FIRM OR SUCCESSOR IN INTEREST IS AN ATTORNEY OF RECORD.”
