The President laid before the Senate the Special Orders of the Day.

Senate Bill No. 16—By Senator Crawford:

#### A BILL ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Fair Election Practices—Campaign Expenditures

FOR the purpose of limiting campaign expenditures, with respect to a simple election, to ten cents times the total population of the state, district, or other area within which the election is held of \$1,000, whichever is more.

BY adding to

Article 33—Election Code  
Section 26-10(d)  
Annotated Code of Maryland  
(1971 Replacement Volume and 1972 Supplement)

Status of Bill: Question is on motion by Senator Crawford to reconsider the vote by which Senate Bill No. 16 failed to be withdrawn from the Rules Committee and re-referred to Judicial Proceedings Committee.
