

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any resident of Maryland who has been licensed prior to July 1, 1974, as a senior teacher is not required to be a high school graduate or equivalent as a prerequisite to further licensure.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1974.

CHAPTER 559

(House Bill 1455)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Service Corps

FOR the purpose of deleting the minimum number of hours part-time members of the Maryland Service Corps work and [[the maximum amount of monetary allowances they may receive]] eliminating the maximum limitation on living allowances received by certain Corps members.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Sections 364A(a) and 364C(a) of Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments, of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1971 Replacement Volume and 1973 Supplement) be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative
Departments

364A.

(a) The Maryland Service Corps is hereby created for the purpose of encouraging and developing a program of full and part-time[, a minimum of fifteen (15) hours per
