

(J) THE COST OF ADMINISTERING THIS ACT IS PROVIDED FOR UNDER SECTION 46A AND 46B OF ARTICLE 89.

(K) IN ADDITION TO THOSE SECTIONS OF ARTICLE 89 SPECIFICALLY MENTIONED, SECTIONS 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41 AND 44 OF ARTICLE 89 ARE MADE APPLICABLE TO THIS ACT.

(L) THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY SHALL APPOINT A CHIEF ELEVATOR INSPECTOR AND MAY ASSIGN DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS IMPOSED BY THIS SECTION TO THE CHIEF ELEVATOR INSPECTOR. THE CHIEF ELEVATOR INSPECTOR SHALL RECEIVE A SALARY AS PROVIDED IN THE BUDGET AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE STATE MERIT SYSTEM LAW.

(M) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE COMMISSIONER OF LABOR AND INDUSTRY SHALL ACCEPT CERTIFICATES OF INSPECTION FROM ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR MUNICIPAL CORPORATION IN LIEU OF CERTIFICATES OF REGISTRATION AND INSPECTION AS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 1975.

CHAPTER 743

(House Bill 762)

AN ACT concerning

Electricity - Electrical Code and Inspectors

FOR the purpose of providing [[a state wide]] an electrical code for certain areas of the state, qualifying certain electrical inspection agencies, providing penalties for violations, and relating generally to electrical codes and inspections with certain exceptions, and correcting certain language therein.
