

THE MEANING OF SECTIONS 19 AND 124 OF THIS ARTICLE, SUCH AS IS PRESENTLY OR HEREAFTER PROVIDED FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN OF MARYLAND.

(A) PURSUANT TO REQUESTS FROM THE APPROPRIATE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL OFFICIALS ON BEHALF OF NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPILS, THE BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS AND EACH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL PURCHASE TEXT BOOKS, AND, UPON INDIVIDUAL REQUEST, TO LOAN THEM TO ALL CHILDREN RESIDING WITHIN BALTIMORE CITY OR THEIR PARTICULAR COUNTY WHO ARE ENROLLED IN GRADES ONE THROUGH TWELVE OF A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL WHEREIN REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT MAY BE MET. THE BOARDS OF EDUCATION SHALL PRESCRIBE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LOANING TEXTBOOKS, SO AS TO MAKE THE TEXTBOOKS, AVAILABLE TO NONPUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN ON A BASIS AS EQUAL AS PRACTICABLE TO THEIR AVAILABILITY TO PUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN RESIDING IN BALTIMORE CITY OR THEIR PARTICULAR COUNTY.

(B) PURSUANT TO REQUESTS FROM THE APPROPRIATE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL OFFICIALS ON BEHALF OF NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPILS, THE BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS AND EACH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL PURCHASE OR OTHERWISE ACQUIRE, PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, THE NECESSARY TEXTBOOKS, THE TOTAL COST OF WHICH IN ANY SCHOOL YEAR SHALL NOT EXCEED AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO [[TWENTY FIVE DOLLARS (\$25.00)]] TWENTY DOLLARS (\$20.00) MULTIPLIED BY THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN RESIDING WITHIN BALTIMORE CITY, OR THEIR PARTICULAR COUNTY, WHO ON THE FIRST DAY OF OCTOBER OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR, ARE ENROLLED IN GRADES ONE THROUGH TWELVE OF A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL IN WHICH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT MAY BE MET. EACH SCHOOL BOARD SHALL PRESCRIBE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE PURCHASE OF TEXTBOOKS, SO AS TO MAKE THEM AVAILABLE TO NONPUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN ON A BASIS AS EQUAL AS PRACTICABLE TO THEIR AVAILABILITY TO PUBLIC SCHOOL CHILDREN, LIVING IN BALTIMORE CITY OR THEIR PARTICULAR COUNTY.

(C) PURSUANT TO REQUESTS FROM THE APPROPRIATE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL OFFICIALS ON BEHALF OF NONPUBLIC SCHOOL PUPILS, THE BALTIMORE CITY BOARD OF SCHOOL COMMISSIONERS AND EACH COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION SHALL PURCHASE INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT AND, UPON INDIVIDUAL REQUEST, TO LOAN THEM TO ALL CHILDREN RESIDING WITHIN BALTIMORE CITY OR THEIR PARTICULAR COUNTY WHO ARE ENROLLED IN GRADES ONE THROUGH TWELVE OF A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL WHEREIN REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE PROVISIONS OF THIS ACT MAY BE MET. THE BOARDS OF EDUCATION SHALL PRESCRIBE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR LOANING INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT SO AS TO
