in February, 1974, it is possible that a life could have been saved had there been an ambulance instantly available on the airport property; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That Governor Marvin Mandel be requested to direct the Secretary of the State Department of Transportation to review this situation and determine the need for a full-time ambulance service specifically for Baltimore-Washington Airport; and be it further
