(House Joint Resolution 71)

A House Joint Resolution concerning

Port Authority Facilities in Baltimore

FOR the purpose of urging [[the State Department of Transportation]] employers of waterfront labor to provide first-aid services at the Port Authority facilities in Baltimore.

WHEREAS, It is in the public interest to promote the effective use of the Port Authority facilities in Baltimore; and

WHEREAS, The Port Authority facility is a busy place, with large numbers of people present every day; and

WHEREAS, There are at present no first-aid services available at the Port Authority facility to those who may need them; and

WHEREAS, The ends of good business and humanity would be served by the availability of first-aid services at the Port Authority facilities; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That [[the State Department of Transportation is]] employers of waterfront labor are urged to provide first-aid services at the Port Authority facilities in Baltimore; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution be sent to Harry Hughes, Secretary of Transportation, P. O. Box 8755, Baltimore-Washington International Airport, Baltimore, Maryland 21240; and Joseph L. Stanton, Port Administrator, Pier 2, Pratt Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21202 for transmittal to the appropriate employers of waterfront labor.
