apply certain money recovered by it for additional projects under that Act.

House Bill 1489, which was enacted by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 30, 1974, accomplishes the same purposes as Senate Bill 869.

Therefore, it is unnecessary for me to sign Senate Bill 869.
