

officers of said fire companies to appear before them and to show to the satisfaction of said Commissioners that any sums of money paid by the said Commissioners to the said fire companies under this sub-title have been expended for the purposes set forth in this sub-title and also that said respective fire companies are active fire fighting organizations. In the event any of the fire companies hereinbefore mentioned cease to remain active fire fighting organizations, or have not used the moneys appropriated to them for the sole purposes set forth in this sub-title, then the County Commissioners are authorized and directed to allocate such unexpended funds to the Contingent Fund of Dorchester County.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1974.

CHAPTER 18

(House Bill 173)

AN ACT concerning

Higher Education - Tuition Waiver

FOR the purpose of authorizing certain students who attend or who graduated in academic year 1973-1974 from the State Colleges or the University of Maryland under a tuition waiver or remission of fees program to satisfy their obligation to teach in certain alternative ways, authorizing the Board of Trustees of the State Colleges and the Board of Regents of the University of Maryland to defer commencement of such obligation and to excuse liability thereunder under certain circumstances, and relating generally to the tuition waiver and remission of fees programs.
