afo John Nevill and in his proper person appeared and prayed his
recognizance might be discharged. Ordered by this Court that
the same recognizance be discharged as prayed.
John Nevill his recognizance as afo taken in the sum of five
pounds is by this Court here discharged. There being
no cause shown to the contrary.

Thomas Wright at last August last entered into recognizance
for his appearance at this Court as an evidence against the afo William
Salisbury and now here at this Court to wit at the Court at the
Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the third
Tuesday in November being the nineteenth day of said month Anno
Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty four came
the afo Thomas Wright and in his proper person appeared and prayed his
recognizance might be discharged. Ordered by this Court that the
same recognizance be discharged as prayed.

Thomas Wright his recognizance as afo taken in the sum of five
pounds is by this Court here discharged there being
no cause shown to the contrary.

John Nevill an evidence in the above cause came into Court and
being sworn on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God saith
that he attended this Court as an evidence for his Lordship against
the afo William Salisbury six days. Ordered by this Court that
there be paid for the same attendance the sum of one hundred
and eighty pounds of Tobacco by the afo W^m Salisbury and that
the Master of the same in behalf of the afo Servant pay the same
according to Act of Assembly &c.

Thomas Wright an evidence in the above cause came into Court and
being sworn on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God saith that he
attended this Court as an evidence for his Lordship against the afo William
Salisbury four days. Ordered by this Court that there be paid for the same
attendance the sum of one hundred and twenty pounds of Tobacco by
