the force and injury when &c. and saith that he
cannot gain say the information and so as against
him brought nor can he say but that he is guilty
of the premises above upon him imposed as by the
said information it is cledged and thereof he submitts
to the Court Therefore it is considered by the Justices
here to wit at their County and at the Court house in the
town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday of
November being the thirtieth day of said month Anno
Domini One thousand Seven Hundred thirty and four that the
said Geo Garnett be fined the sum of five Hundred pds
of tobacco according to Act of Assembly in such case
made and provided And that two Hundred and
fifty pounds of tobacco halfe the sum of the above
said five Hundred pounds of tobacco be applyed
to the use of his Lordships and the remaining two
Hundred and fifty pounds of tobacco be applyed
for and to the Free Schoole in said County and it is
also considered that the same George Garnett pay
the sum of two Hundred and fifty two pounds
of tobacco costs accruing on the premises and to
the Officers of this Court
