order the sum of two Hundred and fifty pounds  
of tobacco part of the fine in the judgement of due  
to his Lordship wherewith the said Benj. Sutton &  
William Clarke Acknowledges themselves to be content

Ordered by this Court that the said Benj. Sutton  
give Security for the fees in the judgement of  
above mentioned

Thereupon the said Benj. Sutton here into Court  
comes and also William Clarke of Kent County  
planter being present in Court in his proper person  
and they Acknowledge themselves indebted to the  
Right Honorable the Lord Proprietary in the Sum of Six  
Hundred pounds of tobacco each to be leaved on their  
bodies goods chattels lands and tenements to the use  
of his Lordship his heirs and Successors Conditionally  
that if the said Benj. Sutton shall not pay to the  
officers of this Court the fees in the judgement of  
mentioned wherewith the said Benj. Sutton & Willm.  
Clarke Acknowledges themselves to be content

His Lordship <sup>and 8 days after the day of Nov 1734</sup> Reminded that Geo Clarke  
of Kent County planter came

Geo Clarke before me one of his Lordships Justices  
for Kent County in the presence of  
Maryland assigned and Acknowledged himself indebted  
to the Right Honorable the Lord Proprietary in the Sum  
of twenty pounds Sterling to be leaved & stored on his  
body goods & chattels lands and tenements to the use  
of his Lordship his heirs and Successors Conditionally  
that if he shall not make his personall appearance
