Whereas it is remembered that on the twenty
second day of October Anno Domini
One thousand Seven hundred
thirty and four came George Garnett of Kent County
Shoemaker before me one of the right Honorable

and acknowledged himself indebted to the right
Honorable the Lord proprietary in the sum of twenty
pounds sterling to be made and levied on his
body goods and chattels lands and tenements
to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors
Conditionally that if a certain Rob^t Blackaby
his servant should not make his personall appearance
at the next Court to be held at Kent County at the
Court house in the town of Chester in said
County on the third Tuesday in Nov^r next
to answer unto what shall be objected against
him on his said Lordships behalf and in the mean
time he is to be of good behaviour where with the
same Geo Garnett acknowledges himself
