house in the town of Chester in said County on the third
Tuesday of November being the thirtieth day of said
month of November One thousand Seven Hundred thirty
and four came the said John Smith and in his proper
person appeared and prayed that his Recognizance
be discharged as prayed.

Ordered by this Court here that the said Recognizance
be discharged as prayed.

John Smith his Recognizance taken for the sum
of five pounds Sterling for his appearance as an Evidance
at the time and place of Robert Blackerby the same
Recognizance is by this Court here discharged.

Then Court for W. it Reminded that on
the twenty second day of October One thousand Seven
Hundred thirty and four came Dan Dillehuntie
of West County planter before me one of his
Lordships Justices of the peace for the said County
and acknowledged himself indebted to the Right
Honourable the Lord property in the sum of five
pounds Sterling to be made and payed on his
body goods and chattels lands & tenements to the
use of his said Lordships his heirs and Successors
Conditionally that if the said Dan Dillehuntie
shall not make his personall appearance at the
next Court to be held at our Court house in the town
of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday of
November Year next then and there to give Evidance
on his Lordships behalfs against a certain Robt.
Blackerby servant to a certain Geo. Gurnett of
the said County Shrotoner wherewith the same
Dan Dillehuntie acknowledges himself indebted
