Remembred that on the Sixteenth day
of November Anno Domini One thousand Seven hundred
and thirty four came Richard Gresham of Kent County
before me one of the Right Honourable the
Lord Proprietary his Justices for the County of
Kent assigned and acknowledged himself indebted to the
Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary in the sum
of twenty pounds Sterling to be made and levied on
his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the
use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors Condi-
tionally that if a certain Richard Combs his servant
should not make his personall appearance at the next
Court to be held for Kent County at the Court house in
the Town of Chester in said County on the third
Tuesday in November Instant to answer unto what
shall be objected against him on his said Lordship's
behalf and in the mean time he is to be of good behavior
wherewith the same Richard Gresham acknowledges
himself content
