to the use of his said Lord ship his heirs and Successors condition-  
ally that if he shall not make his person all appearance at  
the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of  
Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in November next  
ensuing and in the mean time he is to be of good behav-  
our wherewith he acknowledges himself content

Likewise James Calver of Kent County Gentl present here in  
his proper person comes into Court and acknowledges him-  
self indebted to the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary his  
heirs and Successors in the sum of ten pounds Current money  
of the Province of Maryland conditionally that if the said William  
Graves shall not make his person all appearance at the next  
Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of Chester in said  
County on the third Tuesday in November next ensuing and in  
the mean time he is to be of good behaviour
