Plaintor being charged by Daniel Delahante with suspicion of
felony taking from him one gallon cagg with about half a gallon
of rum in it the said Mitchell acknowledged he had a cagg with
rum in it, But says he had it from a Saylor but does not know
his name nor what Vessel he belonged to

Samuel Milbourn sworn and declared, that on the fifteenth
Day of October at night a certain Mathew Mitchell came to him
told him that he had some rum in a cagg and ask if he would give
and drink with and that the said Mitchell asked him if he did
not hear an Enquiry about a cagg and rum that was sent
at Daniel Delahante's which cagg of rum he the said Mitchell
told him Milbourn he threw out of Daniel Delahante's
Window and that he Milbourn did give with the said Mitchell
and drink rum out of a cagg the found evening

Cornelius Foot being sworn and declared that on the
fifteenth October at night he was in company with Mathew
Mitchell and that he saw Mitchell had rum in a cagg and
heard him say he threw the cagg out of the Window and that he Foot
drank some of the rum with him but did not hear him say where
he got the cagg or rum any other way than above said
