Therefore it is considered by the Justice hereto to wit at
Kent County at the Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the day
& year aforesaid that the said Volvntine Lynton pay the sum of two pounds current money
of Maryland as a fine for the said assault & Battery. As also it is con-
sidered by the Justice aforesaid at the said place aforesaid that the said Volvntine

Jurors of the Court and others &
