Thereupon George Griffith of Kent County Planter and Present herein Court in his proper person Acknowledgeth himself Indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord Propy in the sum of Five hundred pounds of tobacco to be made and Secured on his body goods and chattels Vnder and Seemeth to the use of his said Lordship his heirs &c forever — With condition that if the said Robert Graves do pay the said Assurance on the premises to the Officer of this Court. Then this Recognizance to be void Else to Remain in full force and Virtue in Law

The Lordship's Command was given the Sheriff of Kent County on the twenty first day of Samuel Barton March in the year of our Lord Seven teen hundred thirty three that he should take Samuel Barton late of Saint Paul Parish in the County of Carpenter if he should be found in his Bailwick and him vafe &c so that he have his body before the Justice of our next County Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday of June next to answer unto a certain presentment for assaulting William Gooding Also that the Sheriff of the sd County have at the time and place aforesaid with him all which said third Tuesday of June being the twenty first day of said month in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred thirty three Cometh herunto William Harris Gentleman Sheriff of Kent County & made return thereof to the Court here.
