Thereupon Cornelius Lemmings of Kent County planter and  
 present hereto Court in his proper person Acknowledges himself  
 Indebted unto the right honourable the Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> in the sum of five  
 hundred pounds of good sound Tobacco to be made and Levied on his  
 Body goods & Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of the said  
 Lordship his heirs and Successors conditionally that if the said  
 Mary do pay the costs Currying on the promises aforesaid —  
 Then the above recognizance to be void else to remain in full  
 force and Virtue in Law

This Lordship's Command was given the Sheriff  
 Samuel Thomas of Kent County on the twenty first  
 Day of June in the twenty second year  
 of our Dominion & in the year of our Lord God Seventeen  
 hundred thirty and six that he should take Major Samuel Thomas  
 late of St. Pauls parish in the County aforesaid planter if he should  
 be found in his Bailiwick and him safe keep so that you have  
 his body before the Justice of our next County Court to be hold at our  
 Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday  
 of August next to answer unto a certain presentment for not  
 clearing the Roads — And that the Sheriff of Kent County  
 Acts at the time and place aforesaid the said Writ &c  
 All which said third Tuesday of August cometh William Har-  
 ris Gent Sheriff of Kent County and made return thereof to the  
 Court here, thereon Endowed as followeth Viz
