Therefore William Davis of Kent County Labourer and present here in Court Acknowledges himself Indebted unto the right honourable the Lord Prop^{ty} in the sum of One thousand Pounds of Tobacco to be made & secured on his body goods & Chattels Lands & Tenements to the use of the said Lordship his heirs and Successors upon Condition that if the afo^d Katharine do pay the afo^d Currying on the promises afo^d to the several Officers of this Court Then this recognizance to be void Else to be in full force in Law

Also Thomas Henney of Kent County Plasterer Acknowledges himself Indebted unto the right Honourable the Lord Prop^{ty} in the sum of One thousand pounds of Tobacco to be made & secured on his body goods & Chattels Lands & Tenements to the use of the said Lordship his heirs and Successors upon Condition that if the afo^d Katharine Henney do pay the afo^d Currying on the promises afo^d to the several Officers of this Court Then this recognizance to be void Else to remain in full force in Law

And now heard at this Day to wit the Seventh on the day of August in the Year of our Lord Seventeen hundred thirty six Came the afo^d Katharine hereto Court in her person
