 the sum of ten pounds current money of Maryland to be made &  
 Secured on their body goods and Chattels Sundry & Inconcrete

to the use of his said Lordship his heirs & assigns upon  
 Condition that if Charles Parker do make his personal  
 Appearance before the Justice of our next County Court to be  
 hold for West County then and there to answer unto such things  
 as shall be Objected against him for Assaulting Mary  
 Branning & in the mean time to keep the peace & be of good  
 Behaviour Then this Recognizance to be void Else to remain  
 in full force in Law

 Oath do present that Charles Parker late of Shrewsbury Parish  
 in the County of Blakemith the <sup>12</sup> day of <sup>June</sup>  
 Seventeen hundred thirty six at the Parish of in the  
 County of and within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon  
 a certain <sup>Mary Branning</sup> in the peace of God and of the said Lord  
 Proprietor then and there being with force and Arms an Assault did  
 make and the same <sup>Mary Branning</sup> then & there did beat wound  
 and Evilly treat so that of his life it was greatly Dispaired and  
 other Harms to then and there did to the great Damage of  
 the same <sup>Mary Branning</sup> and against the peace of the said  
 Lord
