Tenements to the use of the said Lord King his heirs & Successors
Upon Condition that if the afo Charles do pay the fees carrying
on the premises afo to the Several officers of this Court: Then
this recognizance to be void Else to remain in full force in
Law

Proclamation be made for the appearance of
Ordered by this Court here that Charles Parker ~~repeal~~
According to the Tenor of this recognizance taken as afo and he
being solemnly called cometh not but maketh Default

After which came the afo Charles Parker and produced to the
Court here the following Petition

To His Excellency Samuel Ogle Esq^r Governour of
Maryland —

The petition of Charles Parker of Hout County
Blacksmith. Most humbly Sheweth —

That on or about the tenth Day of July last your Petitioner
being bound in Recognizance before M. Gideon Peardon of this
Lordships Justice of the Peace for Hout County in the sum of two hundred
pounds currency, with Condition that he should appear at the then
next Court to answer a Charge against him for Assaulting and
Beating One ~~Ray~~ Mary Brauning, as was supposed, and
(that
