Ordered here at the Day Court being the 17th day of Nov. in the year of our Lord Seventeen hundred thirty six (1736) that the said property by Francis Francis his Attorney and Prayers that the said Archibald to the Indentment as might answer

All which said third Tuesday of November being the Day & Year as Cometh hereinto Court the said Archibald in his proper person hath that he cannot gain say the Indentment as was a payth him brought nor can he say but that he is guilty of the promises as above upon him imposed as by the Indentment as it is alleged & thereupon he submit to the Court

Therefore it is considered by the Justices here Court at West County and at the Court house in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday of Nov. being the 17th day of said month in the year of our Lord God Seventeen hundred thirty six that the said Archibald pay the sum of thirty Shillings current money of Maryland as a fine for committing the said fornication

Also it is considered by the Justices as at the time & place as that the said Archibald pay the sum of three hundred & seventy four pounds of tobacco Cooks Arrears on the promises as to the several officers of this Court

Ordered by this Court here that the fine as be Delivered the Sheriff of West County And William Starr is Sheriff of West County and pro se therein Court Acknowledges the receipt of the same

Ordered by this Court here that the said Archibald give Security for the Good and Arrears on the promises as to the several officers of this Court

Thereupon Daniel Perkins of West County Miller right & pro se therein Court in his proper person Acknowledges himself Indebted unto the right Honourable the Lord Prop^r in the sum of One thousand pounds of tobacco to be made & Cooyed on his Body good and Chattels Sads and Tenements to the use of the said Lordship his heirs and Successors upon Condition that if the said Archibald Brown do pay the Good and Arrears on the promises as to the several officers of this Court Then this recognizance to be void Else to stand & remain in full force in Law
